They put up a display in the living room. Everyone passing by stopped to look and reminisce. The elder's names were on their treasures. I was excited to see that something had been spur of the moment, not on the calendar, and just for the fun of it. I think a big part of this is that our carepartners now know that they have permission, that they are encouraged to try new things and that they are excited to make the difference in elders' lives.

One Eden home in Iowa, Manilla Manor, has beacon of light projects. Every staff person makes a scrapbook page of how they spent time with an elder.

One big road block is "professional distance." PD is a sad commentary on our institutional model nursing homes. If we could eliminate PD, we could truly find what is meaningful to each elder.
